IWC UK MERCHANT AWARDS, IWC GREAT VALUE CHAMPIONS, IWC CHAMPION WINES, IWC WINEMAKERS OF THE YEAR



### 'THE PLAN WAS TO TAKE IT EASY'

There was a new award this year at the IWC UK Merchant Awards – Restaurant Initiative of the Year 2021. It was created "to recognise and reward the huge efforts" made by restaurants during what Helen McGinn, one of the judges, described as "absolutely an Annus Horribilis" for the hospitality sector.

The deserving winner is The Harrow at Little Bedwyn, Wiltshire.

Having put The Harrow up for sale in March 2020, with a view to retiring after 21 years of successful trading, Sue and Roger Jones' plans were put on hold by the Covid-19 pandemic. Far from taking things easy, they started providing free meals for those who needed them and then launched an online shop offering "Michelin quality dishes" as takeaways to cheer customers up during lockdown. They have now taken the property off the market and turned it into their home with a wine shop at the rear – and are still doing gourmet takeaways for collection on Friday mornings.

Roger explained what happened: "We had planned to retire in March 2020 – we announced this in December 2019 – and then put The Harrow on the market. Then Covid (hit), so after we shut as planned, we prepared free food for the needy, delivering to a 10-mile radius free. We did this for six months.

"Then we were asked to do a paid takeaway, so from May 2020 to this day we offer a gourmet takeaway at £45pp for pick up every Friday morning – it's an eight-course menu that's simple to finish off. On some Fridays we hit 200 which is far higher than we could do in a week with the restaurant.

"As property values increased outside London, we took the Harrow off the market and transferred it into a five-bedroom house for us to live in, keeping the kitchen for now for takeaways but also building a Wine Studio at the rear to sell rare and iconic wines and host special wine lunches.

"For the future we have pre-orders for our takeaways up to October which I have to balance with my wine work (producing food and wine videos for companies like Wine Australia, writing and judging), so retirement is not quite there yet but Sue and I are having a ball whilst we contemplate taking it easy..."

A highly commended award in the Restaurant Initiative of the Year category went to Tranga, in London, which also opened its doors to the community during this tough trading period.



### HONOUR FOR AURELIO

The Lifetime Achievement was awarded to Chile's Aurelio Montes, who cofounded Viñas Montes in 1988 to produce premium wines for the export market.

All he had at that time was a dream he shared with a few colleagues. They built Viñas Montes, in the Colchagua Valley, from nothing. The wines are now available in more than 100 countries and critics rave about them.

Reflecting on the success, Aurelio recalled the thinking behind it: "I thought Chile deserved to produce better wines because the conditions here – geographically speaking, climatically speaking, even the skills of the people – were pretty well suited for something better than 'good value for money'."

So, with a wife and five children to support, he quit his job... to become a consultant and start Viñas Montes as "a little retirement project".



### THE BIG WINNERS

The Wine Society picked up six awards while Liberty Wines picked up four.

The Wine Society was named IWC Merchant of the Year, which, from a retailer's point of view, represents the highest pinnacle within UK wine retail.

The Wine Society, was also named Dynamic Merchant of the Year. "They didn't miss a trick," the IWC UK Merchant Awards judges said after seeing how The Wine Society looked after its members and suppliers – ordering more wine than ever before – during the strangest of times.

The Wine Society also took the title of Wine Club of the Year and the specialist retailer awards for Austria, Regional France and Portugal.

"It's always good to benchmark ourselves against our peers, and the IWC Merchant Awards allow us to do just that," said Ewan Murray, public relations manager. "While our members know that we are all about championing the joy of good wine, and they consistently tell us what a great job we're doing, it's heartening to have that third-party endorsement."

The other big winner was Liberty Wines. It was named IWC Large Agent of the Year, a category sponsored by Harpers Wine & Spirit. The judges were impressed with the business's "great attention to detail and great numbers".

Liberty Wines also picked up the award for IWC Wine Educator of the Year, sponsored by WSET, and the specialist awards for Australia and Italy.

As we know, small and mediumsized agents are also important for the trade. **Daniel Lambert Wines** triumphed in the small agent category after seeing 55% growth and supporting his suppliers. During the presentation, Daniel was given a shoutout "for his tireless efforts lobbying for the removal of the dreaded VI1 forms".

The medium agent award went to a company that has secured additional agencies, absorbed them effectively and came out fighting in a tough year – **Bancroft Wines**.



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### **HOW TRING WINERY REINVENTED ITSELF TO SURVIVE**

Tring Winery collected the IWC Innovator of the Year award for its Online Wine Tasting Club. When lockdown hit in March 2020, co-founders Alex Taylor and Jamie Smith swiftly pivoted the business, carrying out online tasting sessions with wine samples sent out in eco-friendly pouches. Here's their story

"We had just opened the doors to our new winery and tasting room in Tring and hosted our first wine tastings when Covid-19 hit. After just 36 days we had to close the doors. Many companies have innovated this year, but we knew that if we didn't do something truly groundbreaking we wouldn't survive for long at all. More tastings were booked, and so we set out to rebottle samples and keep our customers happy via Zoom. But rebottling is difficult, wine quality can't be guaranteed and shipping of glass is expensive and carbon intensive.

"By April we decided that flexible packaging was the way forward, and began a process to miniaturise bag-in-box technology. This required a different film, a different process, different machinery and vastly different boxes. We designed all of these from scratch and invested more than £100,000. Our new-to-category solution now boasts less than one-tenth of the CO2 emissions of wine samples shipped in glass bottles.

"We also have developed our live streamed show twice a month for wine 'discoverers' and wine 'adventurers' and this brings wine to consumers that they wouldn't have otherwise considered, in a fun, relaxed and unpretentious format. In every aspect, we believe we are doing direct-to-door wine tastings

in a totally innovative way. Going forward we believe our solution will be a game-changer for consumer sampling, extending the footprint of trade events and wine education

"After shipping more than 16,000 tasting sets, we are delighted to have won the IWC Innovator of the Year award. It has been incredibly hard work, and this recognition is real validation of the fact that we have created something truly groundbreaking. The fact that we have also created something that

The IWC Online Retailer of the Year, Laithwaites, was praised for "their service level and attention to detail, which is second to none". The judges added: "We love the free Champagne campaign, and the reasoning behind it.'

Cambridge Wine Merchants, who picked up the large merchant award (sponsored by Maison Castel), were described as "very much at the cutting edge of their game", having executed many innovations with speed and accuracy.

The National Merchant Award went to **Majestic** Wine, marking the in terms of service, range web presence and all-round improvements. Majestic Wine also won the award for the Consumer Campaign, for its List of Spring - which put them back on the map in a saw them re-engaging with their consumers.



Waitrose & Partners also collected two awards: IWC Supermarket of the Year (sponsored by Encirc) and it retained its title for English wine. "It reflects the dedication of the buying team, but also our supply chain, our relationships with our producers, our specialists in shops and the extended team looking after our events and experiences." the company said.

Co-op won the National Convenience Chain category (sponsored by Lancaster Wines). The judges said the Co-op "does it well ethically, morally, with great logistics and they have weathered the storm and grown their market share while improving the quality of their range".

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

It was a good night for Maison Albert Bichot. The Burqundy estate produced the Champion Red Wine, the Clos de la Roche Grand Cru Cuvée Cyrot Chaudron Hospices de Beaune 2019, while its Corton Charlemagne Grand Cru Domaine du Pavillon 2019 won the Organic Trophy.

It was also a good night for the Languedoc region. Les Domaines Paul Mas now has two Great Value Champion wines in its portfolio: its Jardin de Roses 2020 was named Great Value Champion Rosé and its Réserve Languedoc Blanc 2020 was named Great Value Champion White.

Having been awarded three trophies, nine golds, 78 silvers and 83 bronzes at the IWC over the past five years, Languedoc producer Cave de Roquebrun was presented with the Len Evans Trophy.

English wine producer Roebuck Estates won the award for the Best Wine in its First Year of Production, the James Rogers Trophy, for its Rose de Noirs 2016.
